With humility, but with great satisfaction it is brought to the attention of the academic community of the School of Intelligence and Counterintelligence, as well as of the national and international academic community, *Perspectives in Intelligence* magazine No. 17, thus share the results of the academic discussion that has been arising among the members of the Research Center of the School of Intelligence and Counterintelligence, in collaboration with researchers from other centers and institutions of higher education. Although it has not been an easy dialogue, it has certainly been helpful, since it has served to significantly enrich both the form and content of the journal, and above all to strengthen the sense of academic quality, which is supposed to exist among researchers, since the purpose and *raison d'etre* of scientific research is the advancement of knowledge and, of course, the search for solutions to the most felt problems of that knowledge, disciplines and society.
